

ARTS INTEGRATION PROGRAM INTEGRATED ARTS EDUCATION



INTENT

To encourage the integration of arts learning into non-arts curriculum and content areas.

DESCRIPTION

This program supports new or expanded educational programming that integrates arts learning into non-arts curriculum and content areas to address emerging technologies, areas of skills shortages, STEM curricula, workforce readiness, and increase student performance.

PROJECT CRITERIA

Projects in this category may include the following:

- Innovate educational programming aimed at students for integration of arts subjects with other curriculum.
- Professional development for teachers and school administrators for integrating the arts into non-arts curriculum.

Eligible projects must:

- Include both arts and non-arts curriculum;
- be planned, organized, and implemented by a committee which could include teachers, teaching artists, representatives from partnering organizations, administrators, students, parents, and/or community members;
- Identify target groups of students, include specific arts learning objectives, and provide a quality assessment and evaluation plan.
- Be a new program or significant expansion of an existing program

Expenses may not include:

- Food
- Receptions / Galas / fundraisers
- Construction costs, purchase or renovation of facilities
- Insurance and legal fees
- Purchases of individual items worth \$5,000 or higher.
- Honorariums (artists and contractors must be paid as fees for services rendered.)
- Please see guidelines and NEA website for additional federal cost principals and unallowable expenses.

MAXIMUM REQUEST

- \$7,500

MATCH REQUIREMENT: dollar for dollar (1:1)

The total project cost must be at least twice the amount of the grant request.

The match requirement must consist of at least 50% cash expenses provided by the applicant.

In-kind non-monetary donations may be counted up to 50% of the required match.

MATCH EXCEPTION

Organizations in communities with populations of 15,000 or fewer:

In-kind non-monetary donations may be counted as 100% of the required match.

PAYMENT OF FUNDS

The award for these grant funds is on a cost reimbursement basis only. Grantee shall be compensated on a cost reimbursement basis only for actual, reasonable and necessary costs based upon the grant budget, not to exceed the maximum obligation established above. Upon progress toward completion of the project, Grantee shall submit invoices on terms acceptable to Commerce, with all of the necessary supporting documentation, prior to any reimbursement of allowable costs. Commerce will distribute requested amounts equal to demonstrated matching funds.

ACKNOWLEDGMENT

Grantee shall acknowledge KCAIC and the NEA in a manner consistent with a donor or sponsor at the level of the total grant amount and in all materials related to the awarded activity. Acknowledgment of the Kansas Creative Arts Industries Commission and the National Endowment for the Arts must be prominently displayed in all published material (printed programs, news releases, web news, email alerts, advertisements, flyers, etc.) and announcements regarding the particular activity or activities supported. The following language is recommended: "This [insert name of organization or project] was supported in part by the Kansas Creative Arts Industries Commission, which receives support from the National Endowment for the Arts, a federal agency." Acknowledgment shall include display of the Kansas Creative Arts Industries Commission logo and the NEA logo on Grantee's website or on printed material including brochures, press releases, etc. Logos will be provided to Grantee electronically.
