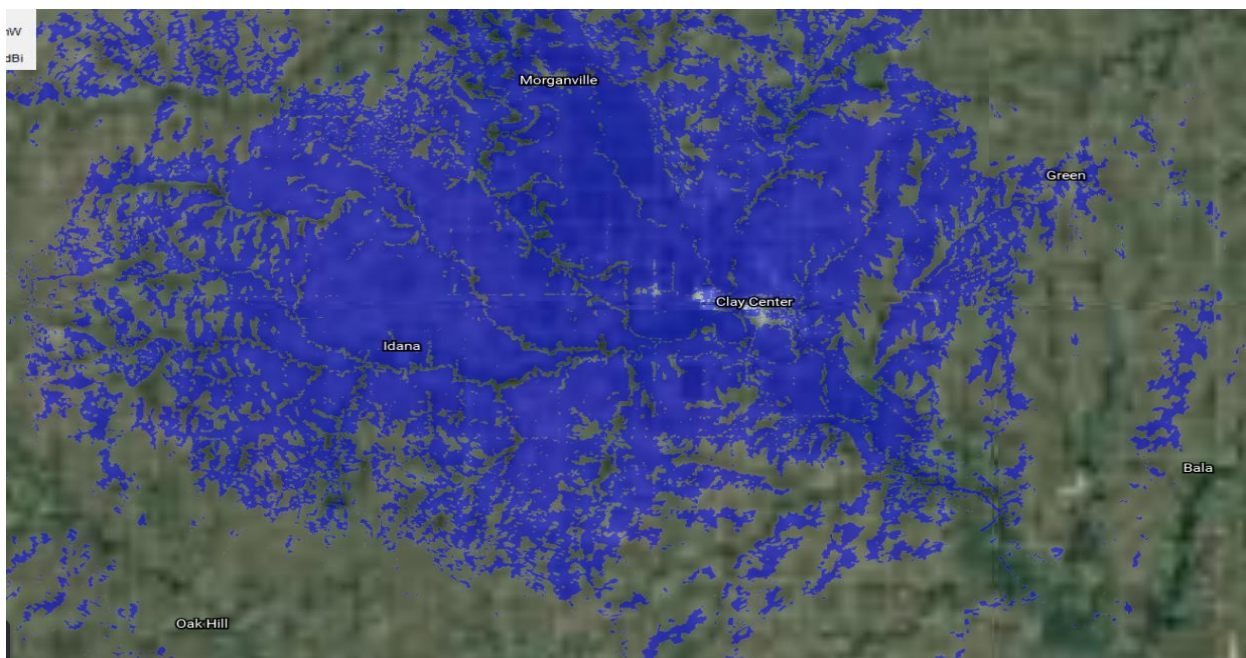

According to FCC 477 data and recent RDOF eligible auction areas, 143 homes in the proposed service area have less than 25/3 Mbps service to their homes or businesses. This disqualifies these households from utilizing telemedicine, telework for public employees, and distance learning options which have growing in importance due to the pandemic. This negatively impacts the ability of governing bodies to provide vital public services to a significant part of the county.

With the help of the Kansas Broadband Acceleration Grant, Twin Valley will design, implement and help fund the most fiscally responsible solution to deploy broadband service to these homes in rural Clay County. By strategically using already existing tower infrastructure, adding another pole, and utilizing industry leading fixed wireless technology that allows for speeds up to 50/8, our network design meets the needs of people in the area today and into the future.

II. Description/Proposed Service Area

The proposed service area for this project will cover the rural areas of Clay Center and Idana in Clay County Kansas. Twin Valley's proposed improvements will deliver at least 25/4 speeds to 143 homes that are currently unserved in rural Clay County with at least 25/4 speeds. 127 of these unserved homes will be able to get up to 50/8 speeds. The goal of this project is to provide reliable broadband connections to the homes in rural Clay County that have been overlooked in the past. Current fixed wireless and copper connections to 143 homes provide less than 25 Mbps and do not meet the needs of the families that live there.

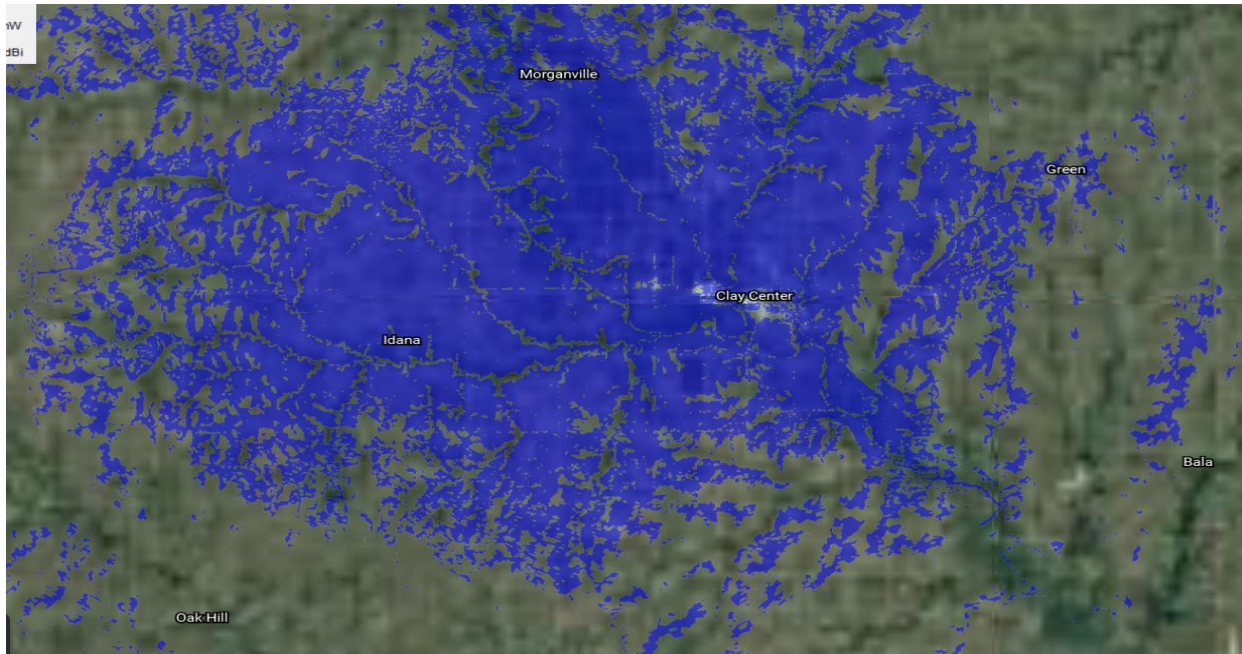

Proposed Improvements

A professional engineer, at our partner Vantage Point Consulting, has performed Radio Frequency Analysis and Design to allow for next generation Fixed Wireless technology deployments to serve residents with speeds up to 50/8. Twin Valley is submitting the showings within this application, with the understanding that broadband services can and will be delivered well beyond the -78dBm threshold specified within the Technical Planning Guide.

This disqualifies these households from utilizing telemedicine, telework for public employees, and distance learning options which have growing in importance due to the pandemic. This negatively impacts the ability of governing bodies to provide vital public services to a significant part of the county.

With the help of the Kansas Broadband Acceleration Grant, Twin Valley will design, implement and help fund the most fiscally responsible solution to deploy broadband service to these homes in rural Riley County. By strategically using already existing tower infrastructure, erecting a new pole and utilizing industry leading fixed wireless technology that allows for speeds up to 50/8, our network design meets the needs of people in the area today and into the future.

II. Description/Proposed Service Area

The proposed service area for this project focuses on homes around the west side of Tuttle Creek Lake. There are 55 unserved location in this proposal that will be capable of 25/4 or greater with this proposal. The 55 homes do not currently have access to 25/3 or greater speeds. These are homes that can not currently be reached with our CERG application build in Riley County. See map below for details.

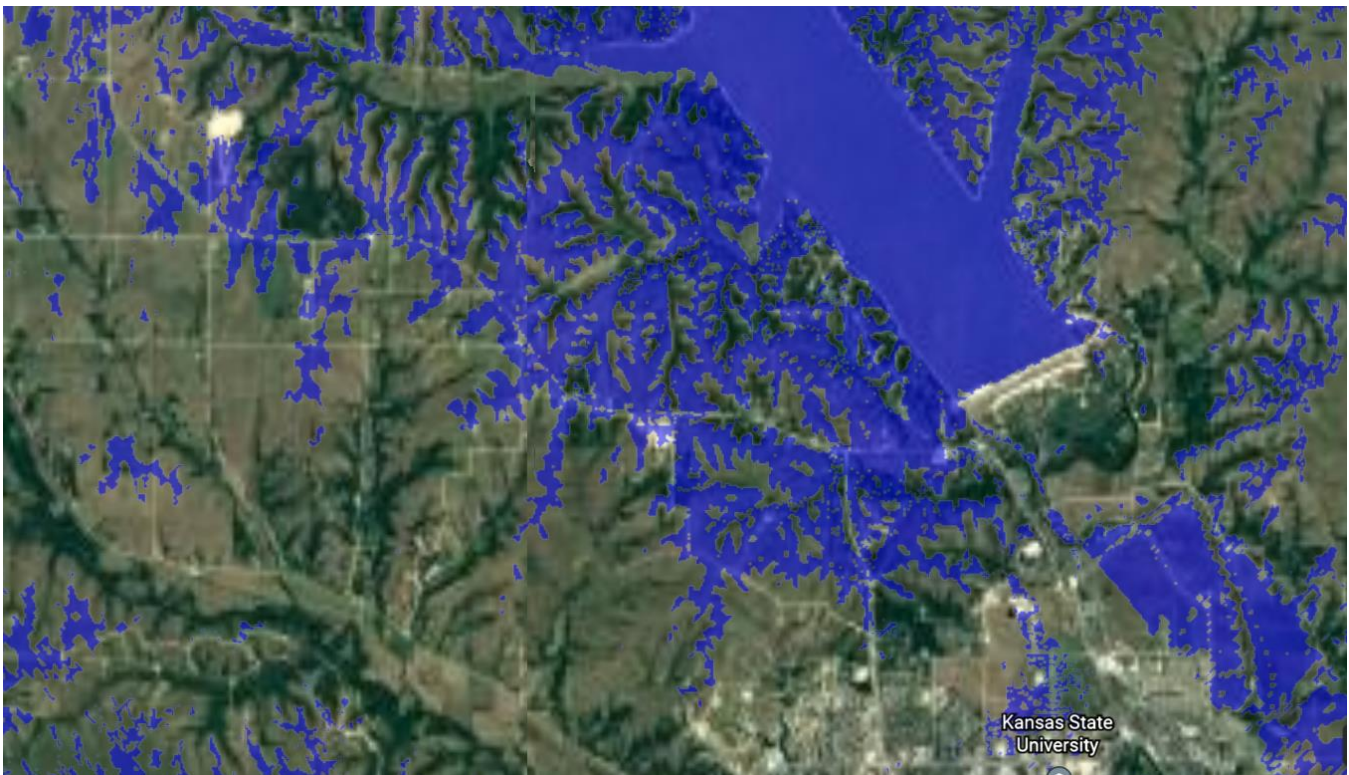

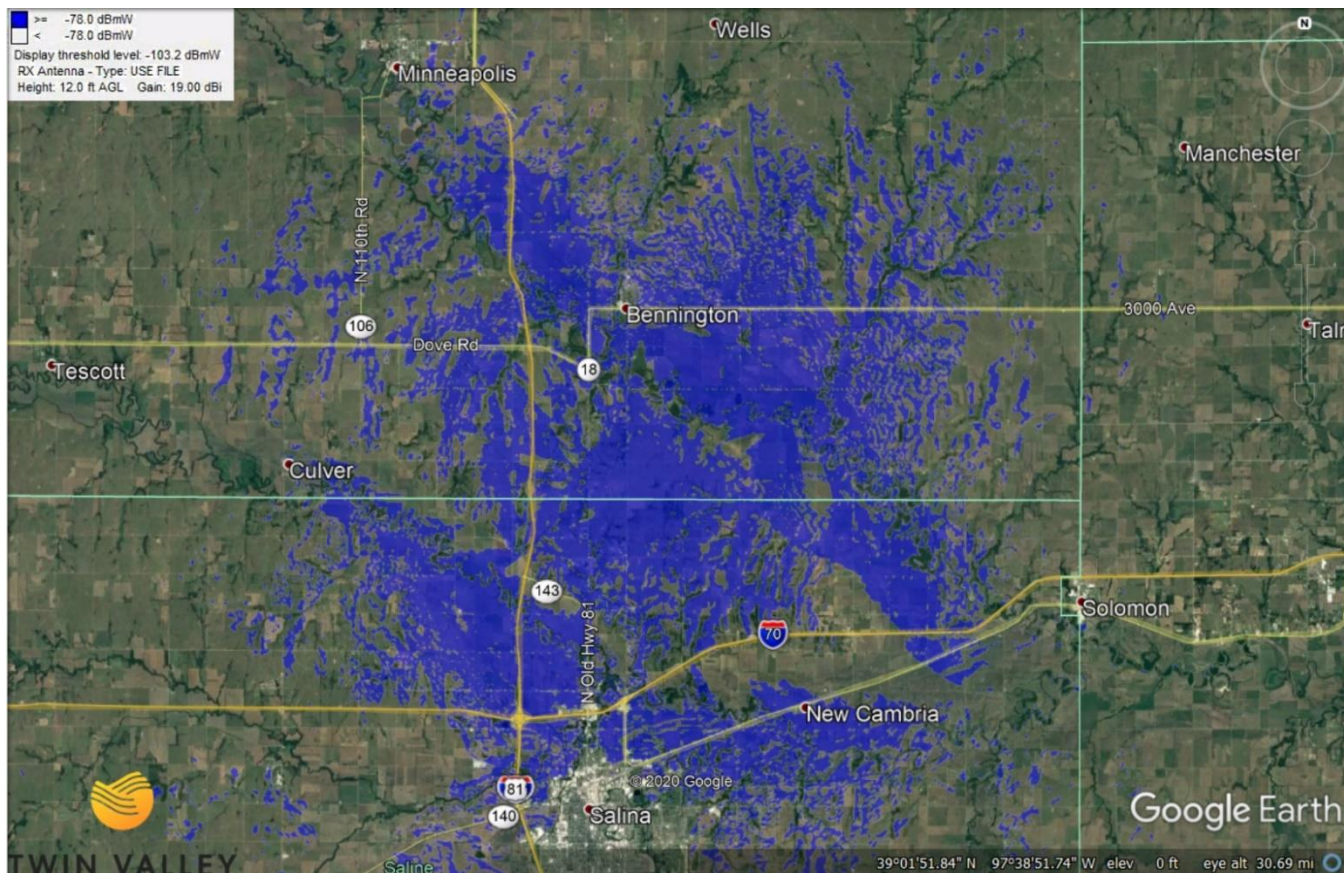

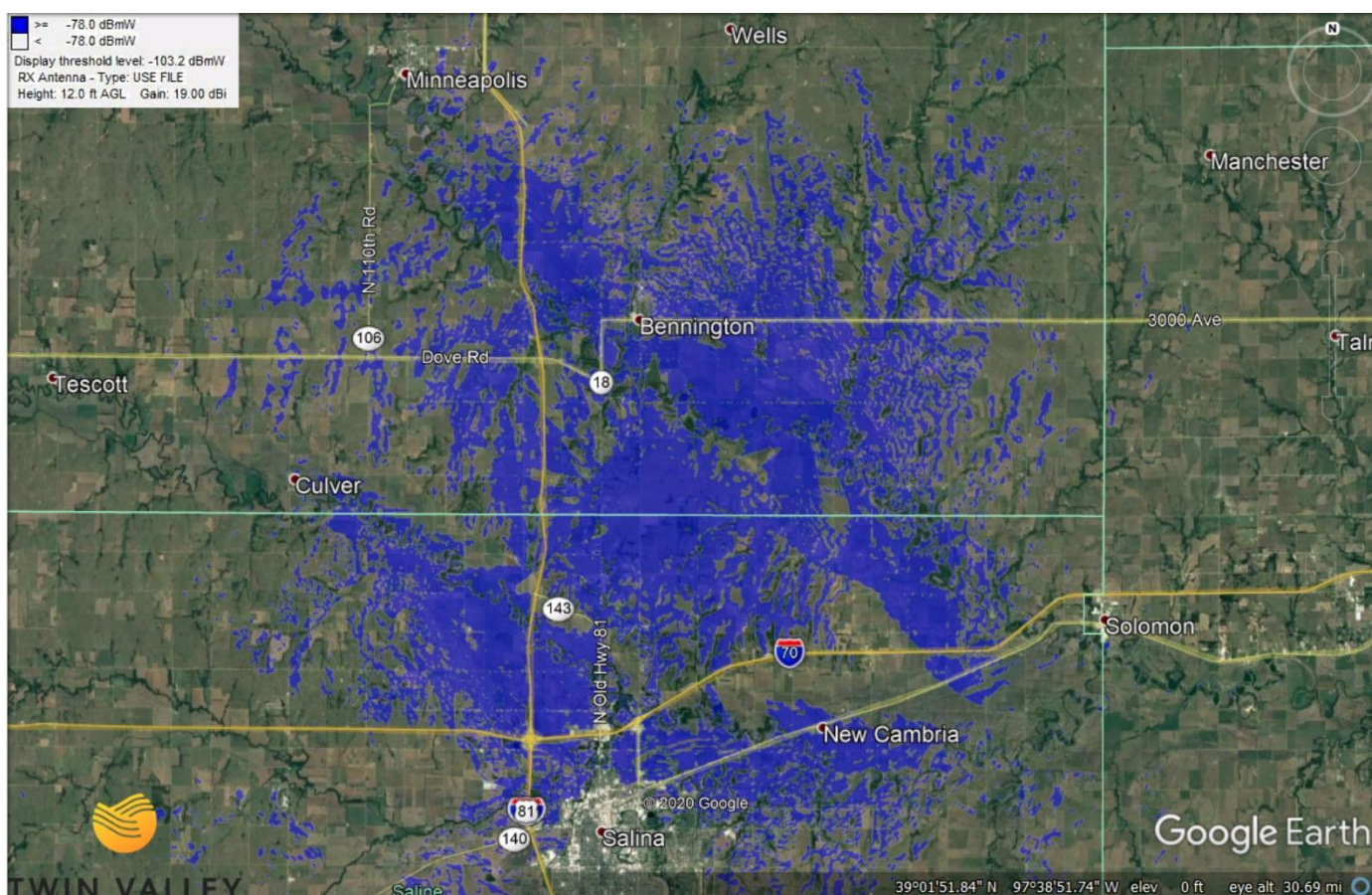
