Please provide your response to the public comments received in the text box below:	<b>Nex-Tech submitted an application for Oberlin town for the following reasons:</b>  <b>1. The City of Oberlin and the Oberlin community approached Nex-Tech and conveyed a need for a local, reliable fiber provider. Nex-Tech has received 72 additional support comments from customers wanting Nex-Tech services in Atwood, including this from a local</b>

**Oberlin resident: “I want to see Nex-Tech fiber in Oberlin because we need high-speed internet at an affordable rate. Vyve has proven to be an unreliable service and does not carry the speed that Nex-Tech could bring. Nex-Tech is already in our community, with a positive impact and involvement. They have been working toward bringing fiber internet to Oberlin for several years, that I am aware of. A few years ago, they brought fiber to our downtown area, with the businesses helping pay some of the expense of bringing it to them. It would be nice to let them expand that service to the residents. They are a "local" company that provides excellent customer service. Nex-tech has been the company that has stepped up to the plate in wanting to bring true fiber internet to Oberlin. Please award the grant to Nex-Tech because it is important to the future of my small town.”** The funds being contributed by the city for the project serve as evidence of their support.

**2. By submitting both an Oberlin town and Oberlin rural application, Nex-Tech intends to provide quality fiber broadband service to the entire Oberlin exchange, not just the town. Vyve does not service the entire rural area of the Oberlin exchange and Nex-Tech is the best opportunity for those areas to receive better service. Providing service to the collective town and rural areas allows for more subscriber density to improve the long-term sustainability of the projects.**

**3. At the time Nex-Tech submitted the applications, it was unclear whether Vyve was adequately serving Oberlin town. The interactive FCC Fixed Broadband Deployment map was showing the town as underserved and community feedback suggested the town was being underserved. After the application was submitted, the FCC Fixed Broadband Deployment map has been updated. Yet, even on the updated FCC Fixed Broadband Deployment map, there are still more than 15 census blocks within the town which are still being shown as underserved.**

**The Capital Project Fund is poised to create a substantial positive impact to the people that live and work in rural Kansas, not just in the near future, but for decades to come. Nex-Tech felt it was important to give these families, business owners and community members a voice. In order to better understand their need for fiber Internet, Nex-Tech created an online form located on the website at <https://www.nex-tech.com/Fiber.aspx> to gather public comments of support.**
