Spectrum Mid-America, LLC, by its Manager, Charter Communications, Inc. ("Charter") is challenging the WANRack NWGardner Grant Application because the project area outlined in the application overlaps Charter's current service area, which is already served with greater than 100/20 Mbps speeds. Specifically, Charter already provides speeds of up to 1000/35 Mbps in the project area. As shown in the attached screen shots of the FCC's national broadband availability map at <https://broadbandmap.fcc.gov/>, nearly the entire project area is already served at speeds of at 200 Mbps upload/ 25 Mbps download; this information should have been included in the original application (Charter's current speeds are much higher than the minimum threshold of 200/25 shown in the FCC maps; we offer up to 1000/35 Mbps speeds). In addition, Charter's network in place today is fully-scalable to offer symmetrical gigabit speeds in the future.

In the attachments provided you will find a KMZ file and overlap map to support the challenge, a list of currently served addresses, FCC Form 477 filings showing our service in the area, and speed test results for 100 addresses across all directional quadrants of the area being challenged.

For our speed tests, we selected 100 random addresses per application of active and geographically dispersed subscribers throughout the project area being challenged. This methodology establishes that the majority of consumers in the designated area have the speeds available to them as we claim and as are represented in the FCC's broadband availability maps. The tests were conducted remotely through DOCSIS 3.0 or newer modems at the subscriber's residence and/or business. The tests capture current downspeed and upspeed and those results are compared to the service package that a subscriber has selected.
