

# Digital Opportunity Connecting Kansans (DOCK) Grant Request. Submitted to the Kansas Office of Broadband Development February 28, 2024

#### **Executive Summary**

Essential Families, a 501(c)(3) nonprofit based in Missouri, with offices in Jackson County, Missouri and Wyandotte County Kansas presents our **Essential Digital Equity Program**.

With a \$250,000 Digital Opportunity Connecting Kansans (DOCK) grant award, Essential Families will pilot the Essential Digital Equity Program in collaboration with the Kansas Community Partners listed below. **179** households/families will participate in the Essential Digital Equity Program DOCK pilot.

- 10 Essential Families trained Digital Navigators
- Quindaro C.O.G.I.C
- Avenue Life
- Unified Government of Wyandotte County

Essential Families is approaching this project as a pilot to demonstrate how the Essential Digital Equity Program scales to any rural and urban community across the state of Kansas, closing the Digital Divide.

As our 5% grant match, Essential Families will provide our Essential Digital Equity Program to nine (9) additional households, at no cost to Kansas Office of Broadband Development (KOBD), bringing households/families served with \$250,000 DOCK grant to **188**.

Today, Essential Families has **87** people residing in Wyandotte County on our Essential Digital Equity Program waitlist.

The Essential Digital Equity Program, built based on empirical data (direct feedback from covered population collected during our pilots), has a very strong and proven digital literacy and skills training components. Our unserved and underserved clients receive life-changing Digital Equity training that enhances digital literacy and skills mastery, is very easy to use, includes brand new touch-screen Chromebook, and more.

In October 2023, Essential Families presented our Essential Digital Equity Program Model to Wyandotte County Commissioners, with the following results:

- Essential Digital Equity Program received well by all commissioners.
- Commissioner Townsend wanted to ensure residents of the NE part of Wyandotte County are served as this is part of her area.
- Commissioner Stikes wanted to ensure Edwardsville and Bonner Springs Kansas are served, in addition to the West end area of Wyandotte County, as this is part of his area.
- It was also noted by the commissioners to serve families East of 55th street in Wyandotte County.
- All Commissioners were very impressed with our programs and knowledge of data that proves the need for our services in Wyandotte County, Kansas.

Our Essential Digital Equity Program satisfies the DOCK grant, and more. In other words, the Essential Digital Equity Program provides Digital Navigator support, enhanced digital literacy and skills training. It also includes a very easy to use, brand new touch-screen Chromebook, and virtual wrap around services that stabilize unserved and underserved households and families, closing the Digital Divide.

# **Description of Location and Anticipated Improvements**

Kansas, specifically Wyandotte County and surrounding rural communities, face significant disparities in digital access and economic development opportunities. As mentioned earlier in this DOCK grant proposal:

- Commissioner Townsend wanted to ensure residents of the NE part of Wyandotte County are served as this is part of her area.
- Commissioner Stikes wanted to ensure Edwardsville and Bonner Springs Kansas are served, in addition to the West end area of Wyandotte County, as this is part of his area.
- It was also noted by the commissioners to serve families East of 55th street in Wyandotte County.

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Essential Families, in collaboration with our above-mentioned Kansas Community Partners will improve:

#### Access to services

Help ensure that people have access to essential services, such as healthcare, education, and employment that stabilize individuals and families to make them ready for digital equity.

## • Civic participation

Help Kansas Covered Populations to ensure that people can participate in civic and cultural activities.

#### Economic mobility

Help Kansas Covered Populations achieve economic mobility.

#### Digital literacy

Help Kansas Covered Population develop digital literacy skills, which are the foundational computer skills needed to access, create, and share digital content and participate in the digital economy.

#### Social services

Help Kansas Covered Populations make social services more accessible online.

#### Cybersecurity

Ensure Covered Populations understand Cybersecurity and how to protect themselves and their families online.

# **Goals and Community Needs**

The Essential Digital Equity Program goal is to close the digital divide by first stabilizing families, by providing proven Digital Literacy, a Digital Navigator and then empowering individuals and families to participate in the digital economy. The compelling need lies in ensuring that personal stability precedes digital readiness, allowing for effective learning and digital economic participation.

The Essential Digital Equity Program targets residents facing economic distress, including the aging, incarcerated, veterans, disabled individuals, and racial or ethnic minorities in Wyandotte County, and surrounding rural communities.

Once the Essential Digital Equity Program is proven in Wyandotte County and surrounding rural communities, it is the intent of Essential Families, with additional funding, to provide Essential Digital Equity Program across the state of Kansas.

Lastly, and our most important goal, is to provide DOCK grant funding accountability by measuring the impact, relative to the significant disparities in digital access and economic development opportunities Kansas community needs. Essential Digital Equity Program impact data will be reported to KOBD in real time through our AI/ML relational database architecture.

#### **Short and Long-Term Community Benefits**

In the short term, Kansas unserved and underserved residents will receive the above-mentioned improvements and benefits.

Long term, with additional funding, Kansas unserved and underserved citizens will have access to our Essential Telehealth, Essential Parenting, Essential Youth Group Mental Telehealth, DIANE, and Digital Workforce Development opportunities. DIANE is our Digital Equity service that supports seniors raising their grandchildren.

Essentially, long term benefits include increased economic opportunities, reduced reliance on public assistance, and enhanced community resilience. By eradicating the digital divide, we aim to create sustainable income and prosperity for generations to come.

#### **Community Engagement Strategies**

The DOCK funded Essential Digital Equity Program is a data driven pilot. Essential Families used datasets from our 2 successful pilots, to identify the below Kansas counties, whose residents qualify for the Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP). Although the ACP is set to expire April 2024, these **122,126** unserved and underserved Kansas county residents, will benefit tremendously from participating in the Essential Digital Equity Program.




As a Wyandotte County, and surrounding rural community pilot, our Essential Digital Equity Program will close the Digital Divide for **188** individual/households. *This approach, as proven on the Missouri side, will benefit unserved and underserved Covered Populations in all the Kansas counties, shown above, closing their Digital Divide*. Please see the letter of support from the City of Kansas Digital Equity Office.

**OmniReach**, our AI/ML Digital Marketing platform, will be used to reach and inform unserved and underserved Kansas Covered Population about Essential Digital Equity Workshops, which includes brand new Chromebook pickup, and enhanced computer and internet training.

#### **Awareness-Raising Efforts:**

As mentioned earlier, Essential Families already has **87** unserved and underserved clients on our Essential Digital Equity Program waitlist. Furthermore, as shown earlier in the DOCK grant request, Essential Families already has data on over **17,000** unserved and underserved people living in Wyandotte and surrounding rural communities.

Essential Families will utilize **OmniReach**, our AI/ML Digital Marketing platform, to reach, inform, and schedule workshops for our current 87 Kansas unserved and underserved individuals and households.



OmniREACH is Machine Learning Marketing.

Machine Learning Marketing is an Artificial Intelligence (AI) technique, that learns and captures data of habits, interests, and patterns of people's online, social, mobile app usage, and physical locations visited.

This "learned" collected data is programmatically analyzed and optimized to determine the best method, relative to cost and management, to stay connected to a person, until

"call to action" desired decision is achieved, or purchase is made.

OmniREACH targets and sends Facebook, Instagram, TikTok, Tweets, Snap Chat, LinkedIn, Google Ads, and TargetText messages to people who are posting on social media, searching online, tweeting, and watching social and economic development content on Roku, Apple TV, Amazon Fire, PS4, and xBox.

OmniReach will also be used to raise Essential Digital Equity Program awareness and register an additional **101** unserved and underserved individual and households, bringing total served to **188**.

Again these 188 unserved and underserved individuals and households will be served in collaboration with Essential Families trained Digital Navigators, Quindaro C.O.G.I.C, Avenue Life and Unified Government of Wyandotte County; by acting as locations, and resources for digital equity needs to be fulfilled.

## **Essential Families History, Mission, and Primary Objectives.**

Essential Families, a 501(c)(3) nonprofit based in Missouri, with offices in Jackson County Missouri and Wyandotte County Kansas, provides crucial children and family development services, virtually, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, from anywhere -like AMAZON delivers products and services to your front door!

Our Essential Digital Equity Program has **five (5)** services designed and built to stabilize children and families, leveraging affordable and reliable broadband Internet.

Once the individual/family is stable, Essential Families has **nine (9)** Digital Workforce Development services (job training programs) designed to enable participation in the Digital Economy by way of good paying work-from-home digital jobs or starting a business.

This proven and sustainable model solves the Digital Divide, enables participation in the digital economy, and eradicates the need for Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP).

The Essential Digital Equity Program scales to any rural or urban community in the United States.

ALL Essential Families Programs and services have established Key Performance Indicators (KPI) and are measured in real time. Program Data is reported in real time to Funders, Donors, Families and Providers like KOBD through our digital portal.

Essential Families has **55** Digital Navigators, with **82** people on our waitlist wanting to be a Digital Navigator. Three (3) of our Essential Families District Navigators Directors and two (2) of Digital Navigators reside in Wyandotte County.

Essential Families wholeheartedly supports additional funding for the Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP). However, our Essential Digital Equity Program is a proven and sustainable model that solves the Digital Divide, enables participation in the digital economy, and eradicates the need for Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP).

Our Essential Digital Equity Program satisfies the objective of the Digital Opportunity Connecting Kansans (DOCK) program administered through the KOBD, and more. A complete description of our Essential Digital Equity Program, with digital literacy, Cybersecurity, and skills training overview, is provided below.

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#### **Essential Digital Equity Program List of Services**

1. **Digital Navigator**- Essential Families has **51** Digital Navigators, **15** are Hispanic Americans. The Essential Families Digital Navigator provides case management-style interventions in the form of individualized support to low income, veteran, those with language barriers, rural inhabitants, those with disabilities, the aging population, racial and ethnic minorities, and incarcerated citizens in rural and urban communities.

The first point of contact for the Essential Families Digital Navigator and the above-mentioned clients is in person, when they pick up their Chromebook. All follow-ups, twice a month, for 3 months, are conducted using Essential Families NoW video streaming platform, a secure Zoom-replacement.

- 2. **ACP Internet Access Assistance** Digital Navigators assist clients with Affordable Connectivity Plan registration, if available. If not, Digital Navigator assist clients with finding the best ISP for each household.
- 3. **New Chromebook** Essential Families provides a brand new, easy to use, touch screen Chromebook to ensure everyone has an equal opportunity to reach their full potential through digital technology. **To our knowledge, we are the only digital equity entity that provides everyone in a household with a new Chromebook.**
- 4. **Basic Computer Training:** Participants receive instruction on the fundamental aspects of computing, including the parts of a laptop, mouse navigation, basic keyboarding, cybersecurity awareness, an introduction to Microsoft 365, and assistance from a Digital Navigator. These navigators help participants identify low-cost, reliable broadband services and conduct scheduled meetings to ensure their ongoing needs are met.
- 5. **Enhanced Computer Training:** Building upon the basics, this component provides more indepth training tailored to individual needs and interests, empowering participants to utilize technology effectively in various aspects of their lives.
- 6. **Senior-Focused Training:** Recognizing the unique needs of older adults, this training focuses on tasks relevant to seniors, such as accessing the Social Security Administration website, online banking, email usage, and other technology-related topics pertinent to their daily lives.

- 7. **EveryThing** Providing local essential resources online 24/7 for Families, through multiple languages, using Google model.
- 8. **NoW Video Conference** Easy Video Conference Anywhere you can Trust. NoW Video is a STRONG alternative to Zoom, Microsoft Teams, and Google meets. NoW was designed and built by our strategic partner 3<sup>rd</sup> Wave Marketing and will soon have "real time" voice translation support.

- g. Essential Telehealth- Patients can see licensed Primary Care Doctors and/or Mental Health therapists or psychologists 24/7 - by video or phone. Essential Telehealth provides the same accurate diagnosis and high-quality care they would receive in person, but from the comfort of their own homes, cars, or ANYWHERE! There are no waiting lists. Physicians can diagnose, treat, and prescribe prescriptions electronically and send them to the pharmacy of choice.
- 10. Essential Parenting- Essential Families offers 10 weekly virtual parental education sessions taught by trained Essential Parental Educators (EPE). This program supports expectant mothers, parents, grandparents, or guardians of children birth to nineteen (19). The importance of having parenting training cannot be understated as a connection to a family's readiness to receive training to close the digital divide. If the home environment is struggling, there is no laptop or job training program that can be effective. Good parenting is an important component of closing the divide.
- **11. Essential Youth Mental Telehealth Groups** Youth 10 years of age and up, Mental Telehealth group sessions by licensed clinicians **24/7**.
- 12. **DIANE** Essential Parenting, Essential Telehealth, and EveryThing (local essential resources) for grandparents raising their grandchildren.
- 13. **Digital Workforce Development** Nine (9) highly Google searched, high-paying, workfrom-home jobs and business startup opportunities. Work-from-home and business startup opportunities include Digital Navigator, Remote Digital Marketing Professional, Essential Parental Educator, AWS Linux Administrator, AWS Cloud Job, Virtual Chef (Meal Prep), AI/ML Developer, and Digital Content Creator.

# Organization's Experience in Providing Digital Literacy and Skills Training to Individuals and/or Communities

Today, Essential Families has served **356** Covered Population individual/households, with **1186** individuals/households on our waitlist.

Over the past two years, Essential Families has conducted two (2) very successful Essential Digital Equity pilots. Our first pilot was funded by Kauffman Foundation and our second pilot was funded by the City of Kansas City Digital Equity Office, with a grant from the Missouri Broadband Office.

During the State of Missouri Digital Demonstration Pilot, Essential Families, in partnership with the City of Kansas City, and nine other grantees were awarded \$25,000 to demonstrate programming to close the digital divide.
