



## Health Effects

- Behavior and learning problems
- Lower IQ and hyperactivity
- Slowed growth
- Hearing problems
- Anemia Increased blood pressure and incidence of hypertension
- Decreased kidney function
- Reproductive problems (in both men and women)

## **Regulated Activities**



- Renovation (RRP): aesthetic or other reasons
- Abatement: permanently eliminate existing lead-based paint hazards

### Thriving Communities Grantmaking Program



#### Environmental Justice Thriving Communities Grantmaking (TCGM) Program

EPA's TCGM program provides at least \$600 million to address environmental justice and public health issues in underserved communities.



**TCGM cooperative agreements are collaborations** between EPA and 11 grantmakers around the nation to reduce the burden of the federal grants application process and distribute federal funds to potential applicants working to address environmental justice issues.

1,000+ Thriving Communities Subgrants distributed by grantmakers will:



Support capacity-building through assessment, planning and project development.



Increase efficiency and reduce barriers to accessing federal grant funding.



Encourage meaningful involvement of community members in decision-making that may affect their communities.


