KANSAS UNIVERSITIES AND COLLEGES

The Animal Health Corridor, which is anchored by Manhattan, includes Kansas City and extends into Missouri, is home to more than 300 animal health companies — the largest concentration in the world. Kansas is home to seven public universities, 20 private colleges and universities, seven technical colleges and 19 community colleges. Leading our animal health education and research are our two Research 1 (R1) universities, Kansas State University and The University of Kansas. In addition, there also are three community colleges in Kansas that offer CVTEA-accredited programs for veterinary technicians.

KANSAS STATE

A recognized leader in animal health and food safety and security, K-State is drawing national research centers to Manhattan. The U.S. Department of Agriculture has established the Center of Excellence in Emerging and Zoonotic Animal Diseases and the Arthropod-Borne Animal Disease Research Unit in Manhattan.

KUKANSAS

KU demonstrates its research and development strengths by conducting nearly \$250 million annually in research activity.



Wichita State University's curriculum focuses on employment in various areas of animal healthcare, including veterinary hospitals and research and diagnostic laboratories.
