Project Summary

Funding from this project enabled Stormont Vail Health to provide quality training support for new nurses through a full-immersion, interactive classroom in their Simulation Lab, allowing them to engage in realistic scenarios through manikin simulations and accelerate their onboarding process. Stormont Vail Health constructed a new training room, equipped with manikins, laptops, monitors, and other essential medical equipment.

Objective: Expand the nursing lab to hold more students.


Objective 2: Equip the nursing training lab with updated training technology.

Target Population

The target population of this project includes new and continuing nurses working at Stormonth Vally Health facilities to increase the continuum of care.

Outcomes

Stormont Vail Health (SVH) completed the newly renovated training facility in October 2024. This state-of-the-art facility is specifically designed to provide ongoing training for new nurses at SVH, streamlining their onboarding process. With this expansion, SVH can now conduct multiple simulation training sessions, enhancing training capacity from a single class of 12 to several classes accommodating over 30 participants.

Sustainability

Stormont Vail Health will continue to grow and expand services across the state of Kansas through foundation grants, private donors, and client insurance reimbursements.
