
Project Summary

The Brown Mansion was built in 1906 and was acquired by the Coffeyville Historical Society (CHS) through a gift, with the condition that the property remain open to the public and preserved its original interiors.

SPRINT funds were used solely for the construction and installation of a new roof for the Brown Mansion.

- The Coffeyville Historical Society was founded in 1967, as a nonprofit organization, dedicated to preserving the heritage of Coffeyville, Kansas.
- The beautiful Brown Mansion is also listed on the National Register of Historic Places, with all of its original furnishings and belongings.

Goals and Objectives

Goal: To perpetuate the history of Coffeyville, Kansas, Montgomery County, southeastern Kansas and northeastern Oklahoma.

Objective: Perform much needed repairs to the roof and chimneys of the Historic Brown Mansion.

Target Population

The target population for this project include families and general visitors, tourists and heritage enthusiasts, as well as educational groups.

Sustainability

The Brown Mansion is in southeast Kansas on Highway 169 near the Oklahoma, Kansas border. This is a highly traveled north south route for travelers and this will offer a respite for these travelers and the opportunity to obtain information on other tourist sites in the state. Its our belief that having modern facilities adjacent to the Brown Mansion with a kitchen, bathrooms, and larger open area we will be able to offer the use of this tourist attraction to larger groups for weddings, family reunions, concerts, etc.

Outcomes

The project was completed in 2024. The new roof provided immediate protection against water damage, leaks and drafts. It also provided better comfort for visitors and contributes to the preservation and sustainability of the mansion
