Project Summary –

Kansas CityPBS (KCPBS), a long-standing public media institution serving 15 Kansas counties, received KPB funding to complete critical technology upgrades excluded from a recent capital campaign due to pandemic-related supply chain issues and inflation. These upgrades will modernize in-studio and remote production capabilities—ensuring continued delivery of high-quality, accessible civic, educational, and cultural content across TV and digital platforms.

Goals and Objectives

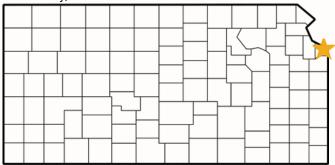
- Goal: Strengthen in-studio production infrastructure.
- Goal 2: Expand remote production capacity.
- **Objective:** Replace outdated studio cameras, lighting systems, and control equipment.
- **Objective 2**: Install fiber cabling and playout servers to support efficient, high-definition content delivery.
- Objective 3: Acquire LiveU encoder, destination server, and Aja Bridge Live Server to enable highquality live coverage of events such as political debates, town halls, and community forums.

Notably, 64% of households earning under \$25,000 rely on KCPBS for education and information, and rural viewers depend on the station as their sole public media source
