Three Grants

- General Operating Support
- Arts Everywhere
- Public Art & Murals



General Operating Support

- Supports overall mission
- Only for arts organizations
- Up to 25% of total operating income



What's an Arts Org?

- Public OR Private
- Includes:
 - Museums
 - Arts Councils and Commissions
 - Arts and culture service orgs
 - Orgs with cultural program activity

SUCH AS...



Art and Culture Orgs

Major Art Forms

Music, dance, theatre, creative writing, literature, architecture, painting, sculpture, folk arts, photography, crafts, media arts, visual arts, etc.

Programs of Museums

Art museums, science or history museums, zoos, arboreta, organizations that exhibit collections, including works of art, historical artifacts, living collections, or other tangible objects to the public on a regular schedule



Arts Everywhere

For arts organizations AND non-arts organizations

Subcategories:

1. Arts in Education
2. Specific Arts and Culture Projects
3. Organizational Development
4. Visiting Artists



Organizational Development

TWO TYPES – Only for arts orgs

Capacity Building

- Up to \$5,000
- Invest in your org’s “toolbox”

Salary Assistance

- Up to \$20,000
- For smaller orgs
- Annual operating income under \$150,000



Arts in Education

- Up to \$10,000
- Bring in professional artists
- After-school programs
- Job training for creative fields



Specific Arts and Culture Projects

- Up to \$10,000
- Individual projects
- Community art
- Music festivals
- Cultural exhibition
- Lecture series on art



Visiting Artists

- Bring in a professional artist
- Up to \$10,000
- Hire artists in any discipline



Compare AE and GOS

General Operating Support

- Overall Operations
- Only for arts orgs

Arts Everywhere

- Specific projects
- Some are open to non-arts orgs

Public Art & Murals

- Up to \$10,000
- Activate public spaces
- Permanent or semi-permanent installations
- Create lasting artistic impact
- Temporary or experimental public art can use Arts Everywhere



Eligibility

- Kansas-based
- 501(c)(3) nonprofit OR public entity
- Private schools and universities need nonprofit status
- Complete one year of arts programming (*your* fiscal year)
- Register with KS Secretary of State Business Services Division
- Have a Unique Entity ID (UEI) from www.sam.gov
- Tax Clearance Certificate



Independent Components

- Year-round programming
- Distinct budget within the larger university budget
- Separate mission
- Independent advisory board
- Dedicated staff and volunteers
- Programs open to the public
- Entire departments don't qualify



How Much Can You Request?

It depends.



How Much Can You Request? (GOS)

For General Operating Support

First, find your total operating income...

...in your last fiscal year, what's your total gross operating income, excluding capital contributions?



Grant Request Limits

General Operating Support

25% of total operating income max

Arts Everywhere: Arts in Education

\$10,000 max

Arts Everywhere: Organizational Development – Capacity Building

\$5,000 max

Arts Everywhere: Organizational Development – Salary Assistance

\$20,000 max

Arts Everywhere: Specific Arts and Culture Projects

\$10,000 max

Arts Everywhere: Visiting Artists

\$10,000 max

Public Art and Murals

\$10,000 max



Matching

All Grants Require One-to-One Match

Requesting \$5,000?
Project budget needs to be \$10,000



In-Kind

A portion of your match can be non-cash contributions



What's "In-Kind"?

- Using a space for free?
The typical space rental is in-kind
- Taxes done pro bono?
Typical pay for similar services is in-kind
- More information for calculating in-kind value is in guidelines

In-Kind Percent

**General Operating Support
and
Arts Everywhere**

Up to 50% in-kind match

Public Art and Murals

Up to 75% in-kind match

EXCEPT...



Expenditures

General Operating Support

- Day-to-day operations fulfilling your mission
- Utilities
- Staff salaries
- Programming costs
- Administrative expenses

Arts Everywhere, and Public Art and Murals

- Must be connected to your project
- Artist fees
- Travel costs
- Project materials
- Marketing for this project
- Public art installation and equipment costs



Non-Allowable Expenditures

- Any state or federal funds
- Any funds used as match for another Department of Commerce grant
- Expenses outside the grant period
- Capital expenditures, like renovations or bricks-and-mortar projects
- Debts, contingencies, interest, non-payroll taxes, bank fees
- Food and drink
- Awards and scholarships
- Private entertainment
- Activities not open to the public
- Re-granting or making donations to other organizations
- Mortgage payments
- Payments to Commerce employees
- The costs of goods for retail, like merchandise and souvenirs



Match-Only Expenses

Allowed in project budget, but not paid for with grant funds

- Equipment costing over \$5,000 per item
- Property improvements
- Permanent fixtures
- Space rental
- Building maintenance



More on Expenses

Public Art and Murals

- Installation and materials costs are allowable
- Modifications to installation site are typically match-only

Scoring

Arts Everywhere and General Operating Support

- 100 points total
- 80+ points for funding recommendation
- Four criteria
 - Excellence: up to 40 points
 - Impact: up to 30 points
 - Management: up to 20 points
 - Accessibility: up to 10 points



Scoring Categories

Excellence (40 points)

- Mission statement clarity
- How well programs support mission
- Clear and measurable goals and objectives
- Quality of proposed programming
- Partnerships and collaborations
- Support materials



Scoring Categories

Impact (30 points)

- Scope and reach of activities
- Who benefits?
- Geographic reach
- Marketing and audience development
- Economic impact in your community



Scoring Categories

Management (20 points)

- Sound budgeting and financial planning
- Clear evaluation methods
- Evidence of fiscal stability
- Plans for sustainability



Scoring Categories

Accessibility (10 points)

- Physical accessibility of your facilities
- Programmatic accessibility
- Written policies and procedures
- Staff/volunteer training
- Efforts to include all audiences

Public Art and Murals

Project Excellence

Management Plan

Strategic Goals and Economic Impact

Community Impact and Engagement - including Accessibility

 - Everyone scoring 80+ is funded
- Arts Everywhere and Public Art and Murals
 - Each ranked project is funded until funds are depleted

- Start now!
- Read the guidelines
- Double-check math
- Strong support materials
- Be specific

Tips #2

- Tell us about your evaluation methods
- Be clear about your accessibility efforts
- Make sure registrations are current
- Look at in-kind limits in budgets
- Answer the question that is asked

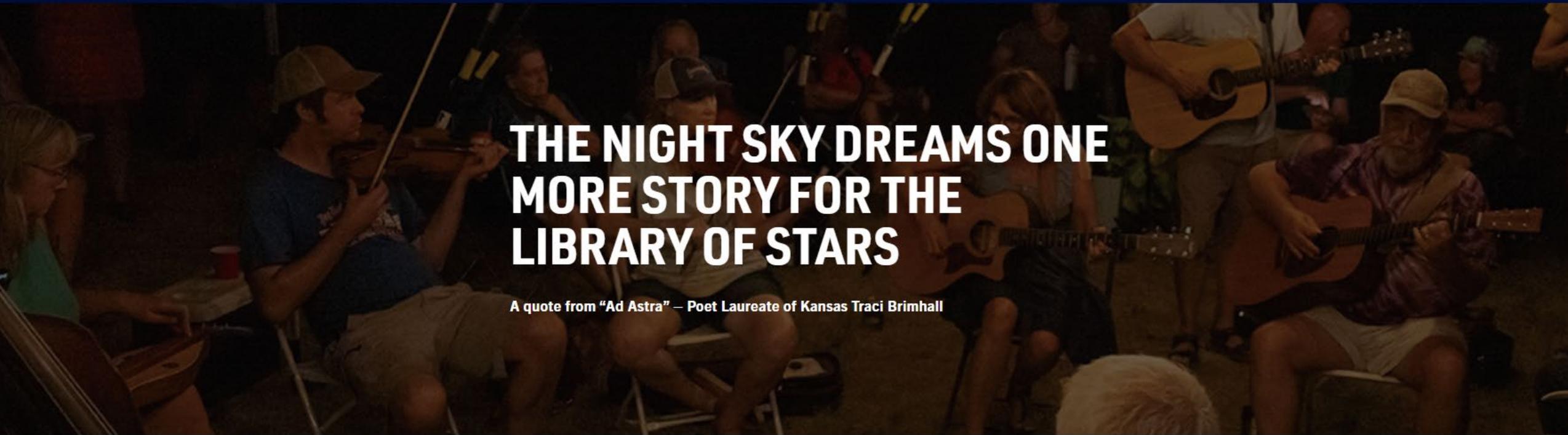
