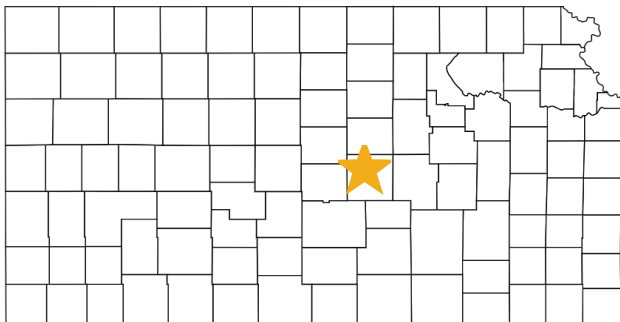

Project Summary

The Lindsborg Old Mill and Swedish Heritage Museum received grant funds to support critical building upgrades and infrastructure improvements, including masonry, ADA access, and other deferred maintenance projects. These improvements protect historic structures, enhance visitor safety and accessibility, and support the museum's ability to attract tourists, boost local businesses, and engage the community, ensuring long-term preservation and sustainability of Lindsborg's cultural heritage.

Grantee Information

The Lindsborg Old Mill & Swedish Heritage Museum in Kansas preserves the town's rich Swedish-American heritage and regional history. Its main attractions include the 1898 flour mill, one of the few working roller-mill flour mills in the U.S., and the 1904 Swedish Pavilion.

Goals and Objectives

Goal: Preserve the historic Lindsborg roller mill while improving the museum's safety, accessibility, and overall visitor experience.

Objective: Renovate and maintain key structures such as the Old Mill, Swedish Pavilion, Academy building, and museum grounds.

- Construction: \$159,420.13
- Exhibit Renovations & Supplies: \$44,549.87
- Masonry: \$31,000.00
- Security System: \$15,030.00

Target Population

The target population for this grant includes local residents, tourists, students, and community stakeholders who benefit from heritage preservation, educational programming, and increased cultural tourism.

Sustainability

The project is sustainable because it addresses deferred maintenance, reduces future costs, and enhances the museum's ability to generate revenue through admissions, events, and community support.

Outcomes

- Enhanced educational and interactive programming through updated exhibitions.
- Preservation of historic buildings and artifacts, preventing further deterioration.
- Improved visitor safety, accessibility, and overall experience.

Activities and Timeline

Q3 2023: Security system installed on the property.

Q4 2023 - Q1 2024: Procurement activities for various scopes of work. Landscaping and HVAC upgrades completed.

Q2 2024 - Q1 2025: Masonry work, facade work, roofing and guttering, and painting scopes of work completed. Exhibit upgrades and renovations initiated.

Q2 2025: Landscaping and fence installation.

Q3 2025: New exhibit installation completed. Remaining landscaping and front facade work completed.
